COURSE OBJECTIVES

At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Define terminology, related to antemortem and postmortem findings, in order to accurately document physical findings.
- Describe the functions of the medicolegal investigation team process, determine the need for a medical examiner, prepare for medicolegal evaluation, and effectively complete documentation for this process.
- Identify and recognize bodily injuries and gunshot wounds, describe manners of death, legal issues, and concepts and principles of toxicology.
- Identify the signs of child abuse, SIDS, homicide vs suicide, pediatric fatalities, environmental hazards, elderly abuse and sexual assault in order to appropriately identify cause of death and assist the physician and police in a postmortem investigation.
